Train & Bus



We don't have a ferry service, but Simcoe County has plenty of transient slips. So if you have your own boat and want to visit us, we're accessible from Georgian Bay, Lake Simcoe, and the Trent-Severn Waterway.

25 MUST DO-TRY-&-SEES IN SIMCOE COUNTY

One rarely falls in love with a place without experiencing its best kept secrets, local favourites, or top wow-factor attractions. We want you to fall in love with Simcoe County. So here you go. Your one stop shop for must-do, must-try, and must-see sights in Simcoe County. Enjoy the ride!

1. Watch a sunset from Wasaga Beach

Dip your toes in the water at the longest freshwater beach in the world, with 14km of safe, white sandy shore, and stick around to see the colourful, breathtaking sunset as it drops into the glistening waters of Georgian Bay. 2. Sip on a Caesar

Try Canada's favourite drink at 1858 Caesar Bar in Collingwood - the first Caesar Bar in North America, offering over 30 unique Caesar "experiences", using their very own premium handcrafted additive, Walker's

3. Go off the beaten path for some jerk chicken

Chow Down at **Angie's Place Caribbean Eatery** in Stayner, known for their jerk chicken roti, but give yourself some time as the lineups are always long (but well worth the wait).

4. Be inspired by the land

Visit Georgian Bay Islands National Park, the landscape that inspired the Group of Seven, and let it inspire you. Oh, and to see some original artwork of the Group of Seven, be sure to stop by **Huronia Museum** in

5. Cruise the 30,000 islands

Hop on board the **Georgian Spirit** or **Georgian Legacy Boat Cruise** and experience the 30,000 Islands, the world's largest freshwater archipelago, designated by UNESCO as a WORLD BISPHERE RESERVE. The area is home to 840 native plant species, 170 types of breeding birds, 44 mammal species and 34 species of reptiles and amphibians.

11. Enjoy the great indoors

12. Stop at the Fry Hut

Simcoe County is scattered with roadside food trucks and fry huts, but we are home to the original deep fried pickle poutine, made by the one and only: JJ's Chip Wagon in Alliston. You should go. Like, right now. 13. Swab the deck of a tall ship

Be amazed by the sheer size of the ship, as you step aboard the H.M.S Tecumseth at Discovery Harbour, the original British naval base from war of 1812.

14. Hang with the monkeys, feed the giraffes 21. Chow down on farm freshness

Walk along shaded trails at the Elmvale Jungle Zoo and view majestic white lions and tigers, the playful monkeys and lemurs, and the rare and exotic birds in the natural surroundings of the zoo's 30 acres.

Jump in the car and drive through Awenda Provincial Park this fall. The bright, full colours of red, orange, and yellow trees will change your life. 18. Try a big taste from a tiny place

You can't stop or stay in Simcoe County without checking kilometres of scenic paved off-road and multi-use gravel out **Creemore Springs Brewery**. They fire-brew their beer in small batches in authentic copper kettles, and they don't just use regular water either. They use water from their local namesake springs. Pretty cool, eh? 19. Schedule some me-time

Take some time for yourself and enjoy the ultimate relaxation, rejuvenation, and revitalization in the heart of nature at **Vetta Spa** in Oro-Medonte.

20. Visit Ontario's oldest European community Step back in time to the 17th century at **Sainte-Marie** among the Hurons, one of Canada's National Historic Sites and learn about the French Jesuit mission in the heart of Huron-Wendat First Nation.

Welcome to farm country! We grow fruits and veggies galore, so be sure to check out a local farmer's market, swing by a roadside stand, or visit a farm gate location like Nicholyn Farms and see what you've been missing. 22. Get back in the saddle

23. Hit the slopes

If you're new to skiing or snowboarding, or a pro – we've got mountains for you! From Snow Valley Ski Resort, Mount St. Louis Moonstone, and Horseshoe Resort to **Blue Mountain**, you'll be thrilled! And if you're into skiing up hills instead of down them, check out Hardwood Ski and Bike, Mountainview Ski Centre, or **Highlands Nordic** from some sweet XC skiing.

24. Ride the Loop Ride, Sally, ride! The **Simcoe County Loop Trail** is 160 trail that travels through nine municipalities, reaches three major bodies of water, and is flat! 25. Eat all the butter tarts

2) Atherly Narrows, Lake Couchiching A great spot to fish for perch from the shoreline. 3) South Basin, Penetanguishene Bay

Wasaga Beach Sports Park to Schooner Town

10 km | 2 hours | Easy/Beginner Home to the largest group of parabolic sand dunes in the entire province, this section of the river meanders along sandy shores, where you can get lost in the beauty of the crest shaped sand sculpted by glaciers and rimmed with dense vegetation. The Wasaga Beach Sports Park offers an ideal launching point due to its many amenities.

A SAMPLE OF CYCLING ROUTES

Simcoe County Loop Trail

160 KM | OFF ROAD/RAIL TRAIL | FLAT/EASY The Simcoe County Loop Trail is a 160-kilometre loop that travels through nine municipalities, reaches three major bodies of water, including Georgian Bay, Lake Simcoe and Lake Couchiching. And is primarily on off-road, multi-use rail trail! The route is flat, scenic and available as a multi-day tour.

Creemore Loop Trail

60 KM | ROAD | MODERATE/ADVANCED The first portion is relatively flat and perfect for your warmup. After crossing County Road 91 you enter more challenging rolling terrain overlooking the Mad River. If you are looking for an opportunity to stop, be sure to take a break in Creemore, approximately halfway through your ride. This town, known for its beer, has some great shops too! On your way back into Collingwood, be sure your legs are ready for a short climb to a fantastic view of Georgian Bay.
