

The park trail leads you to Main Street, where you can stay for the day, enjoying shops, restaurants and cafés.

And don't miss live music in the amphitheatre during Bayside Summer Soirée on Friday evenings during the summer months!

Explore one of Ontario's last original general stores and learn about the area's early lumbering industry at the Penetanguishene Centennial Museum & Archives. Built in 1875 by Karl Maxillian (Charles) Beck, this historic building now hosts the stories of Penetanguishene's cultural past. Rain or shine, the museum offers programming and special events throughout the year as well as an active genealogical research room, and varied travelling exhibits. Wander the museum grounds or find a Penetanguishene souvenir at the Timber Bay Gift Shop.

If you are up for some walking, join one of two walking tours, offered on select dates from June to October. The Downtown Historical Walking Tour offers insight into the history of the homes and businesses on Main Street, showcasing archival photographs as well as lively interpreters. The Rotary Champlain Wendat Park Walking Tour highlights the Indigenous and Franco-Ontarian history of our area through interpretation of the many art sculptures.





HURONIA MUSEUM

Located in beautiful Little Lake Park, in the centre of Midland, the Huronia Museum has preserved the history of this region and its people for over 75 years. It boasts a robust collection, including tens of thousands of artefacts ranging from photographs to Indigenous archaeology.

Visitors to the Museum are treated to the pre-contact Huron/Ouendat replica village, including a lookout tower, wigwam, and a full-size longhouse. Take time to browse the largest collection of Group of Seven paintings north of the Greater Toronto Area, a collection of First Nations art, and an extensive exhibit on the great vessels that have travelled Georgian Bay.



The Heart of Georgian Bay is a cultural destination like none other. Here you can find museums and living history sites representing time periods from the 17th to 20th century, that tell the stories of those who have resided here throughout the ages. You can also find an exciting arts community, inspired by the sights and sounds of Georgian Bay. Hear the mother tongue of our Franco-Ontarian residents and see the colourful influence of our Indigenous

community. Attend an award-winning cultural festival. There is no lack of cultural assets to explore. If visual art is what inspires you, the **Midland Cultural Centre** should be your first stop. Access three free art galleries, with rotating exhibits. Don't miss the newly dedicated **Gallery of Indigenous Art**, telling the stories of this vibrant part of our community. Just down the road, the **Huronia Museum** houses a large collection of work by the Group of Seven, famous for their depictions of Canadian landscapes, including many scenes of Georgian Bay. Here you will also find exhibits on the evolution of Midland as well as a reconstructed pre-contact Huron-Ouendat village.

For the more dramatic visitors, there are three options to enjoy performing arts, as well as many opportunities for live music. You will find a wide range of performances hosted at the Midland Cultural Centre, from award-winning musicians of all genres to intimate conversations with Canadians of significance. Under the same roof is the Huronia Players Theatre, a community theatre group who host three productions per year in their intimate 120-seat, state of the art theatre. It's location in Downtown Midland pairs perfectly with dinner for a romantic date night. For a professional theatre experience, head to to the King's Wharf Theatre in Penetanguishene. Named for its location in the historic wharf of Discovery Harbour, Drayton Entertainment stages seasonal productions for all ages and are looking forward to welcoming theatre-lovers back after two years of closures. This summer's line-up won't disappoint and the location couldn't get any more beautiful. Be sure to leave yourself a little extra time to stroll the

Climb aboard resident tall ships, or visit the original hull of the HMS Tecumseth which sunk in Penetang Harbour over two hundred years ago.

All with the best Georgian Bay views. Experience the spookier side of the site on a ghost tour - offered exclusively during the summer months. Visit the **Penetanguishene Centennial Museum** & Archives for an intimate look



at life in Penetanguishene. Highlights include Simcoe County's oldest car and a fully stocked General Store circa 1875. If you think you may have genealogical ties to the area, make an appointment to deep dive into their extensive genealogy room. Who knows what you might find! And last, but certainly not least, don't miss a visit to **Sainte-Marie among the Hurons** and **Martyrs' Shrine**. Immerse yourself in the lives of the first European settlers and their interactions with the local Indigenous people over 400 years ago. Together, these neighbouring attractions make a great day steeped in history.

ONTARIO'S BEST BUTTER TART FESTIVAL

June 8 along King Street, Midland

A butter tart is a delectable pastry filled with a sweet filling made of butter, sugar, egg and syrup. This one-day festival is your chance to get your hands on 200,000 of them, and the best of the best are here - there is even an official competition to determine Ontario's Best Butter Tart! Stroll King Street to find 200 vendors with traditional tarts with nuts or raisins, unique tarts, award-winning tarts, and everything in between. Every year on the second weekend in June.

LE FESTIVAL DU LOUP | July 20 at Parc Lafontaine Park, Lafontaine

This weekend of festivities celebrates the pride of the deep rooted Francophone community in the area through music, food and fun. Its name comes from the local legend of the 'Loup de Lafontaine', a wolf that terrorized the divided community, and how it made them stronger in the end. Programming is offered entirely in French. Venez hurlez avec nous!

TINY FARM CRAWL | August 24 at participating farms in Tiny Township

This unique event provides participants with the chance to explore the beauty of the Heart of Georgian Bay while learning more about agriculture and supporting local growers and farmers. Farmers will share their unique perspective on agriculture and its viability and participants will hear about the importance of local food and its economic impact.

FIRST LIGHT | November 21-24, 28-31 & December 5-8 at Sainte-Marie among the Hurons First Light is an enchanting holiday tradition for young and old. The 17th century French mission is illuminated with over 5,000 candles and brought to life with the sounds and smells of the festive season. First Light offers visitors a unique experience with on-site music, crafts, food tastings, and over 50 unique vendors.

FIND DATES AND DETAILS AT GBAY.CA



The Heart of Georgian Bay has drawn visitors from all corners for as long as the term "tourist" has existed - and there is no shortage of ways you can explore the great outdoors in our little piece of heaven.

For those wanting to get out on the water, there are two new sightseeing cruise ships in the area. The 'Georgian Legacy', operated by Landmark Cruises, is docked at the Penetanguishene Town Docks and may look familiar. The 'Spirit', operated by Georgian Spirit Cruises is docked in Midland. Both offer daytime and evening sightseeing tours, to cruise through the picturesque 30,000 Islands of Georgian Bay. For a more intimate fishing or sightseeing experience - book a private charter with one of our trusted operators. If you have your own watercraft, there are marinas scattered along the waterfront, but if you don't - Diverse Rentals & Tours is your source for motorized watercraft and water toy rentals and boat tours.

Tiny Township is home to 70km of freshwater shoreline, with five parks identified for public use. Visitors to the area can use pay-to-park stations at Balm Beach, Jackson Beach, Lafontaine Beach and Woodland Beach. The fifth, Bluewater Beach, is available only to those with resident parking passes. Balm Beach offers the most amenities, including restaurants, public washrooms, an arcade, and a playground.

To explore by land, you have a number of options. Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre is home to 3,000 acres of provincially and federally

significant wetlands and woodlands. Explore 25kms of trails, or participate in daily programming and special events during all four seasons to learn a little more about the creatures that call the marsh home. Stroll through Penetanguishene's waterfront Parc Rotary-Champlain-Wendat Park to find historic statues as well as park amenities like a splash pad, playground and live music at the amphitheatre on Friday evenings in June, July and August. Whether you prefer biking, hiking, cross-country skiing or birding, Awenda Provincial Park is a must-see for year-round explorers. Purchase a day-pass or reserve a campsite for access to 31kms of trails, an inland lake, stunning Georgian Bay beaches, incredible views from the bluffs, and more.

Book your tee time at **Balm Beach Golf Club**, **Brooklea Golf & Country Club** or **Midland Golf & Country Club**, for a guaranteed good time. If you're all about the fun - bring the family to play the mini putt course at **Balm Beach Go Karts & Mini Golf**.

Rolling from Collingwood to Orillia, through the Heart of Georgian Bay, the Simcoe County section of the GREAT LAKES WATERFRONT TRAIL is set up perfectly for a multi-day ride. This newly completed 255 kilometer-long trail features off road pavement, some crushed limestone trail and some on-road country highways. Signage was completed in spring of 2022 and you'll pass through wetlands, beaches, farmland and so much more. Grab a room halfway along the trail in Midland, at the bike-friendly Quality Inn or Comfort Inn.

Starting in Downtown Collingwood, you'll find a vibrant cycling community; there are multiple bike shops in town, so if you need some gear before starting your journey this is the place to do it. From here the trail continues east towards Wasaga Beach. As you head north you'll encounter the beaches of Tiny Township; Woodland Beach, Georgian Sands Beach and more. They're all spectacular viewpoints and there are plenty of places worth stopping. If you're getting low on calories around here, the **Tiny Treats European Deli** in Lafontaine has some seriously delectable goodies.

Moving east, the Great Lakes Waterfront Trail takes you through Awenda Provincial Park; if you're the bikepacking or camping type, this is a great place to stay. There are a couple more stunning beaches in the park, great places to cool off with a swim. Otherwise, carry on and enjoy the winding treelined roads of the park.

In Penetanguishene, **Cafe Kitty HawK** is a great place to stock up on calories for the final push to Midland.

Midland is the perfect place to spend a night or two; you could stay a second night and do the 66-kilometre Big Chute Loop which takes you up to the Big Chute National Historic Site. While in Midland don't miss out on dinner at the beautiful waterfront patio of **The Boathouse Eatery** and morning in-house roasted java at **Grounded Coffee Co**.

Carrying on the main route from Midland, you'll end up on the Tay Shore trail for nearly 20-kilometres. This paved trail starts along the shores of Matchedash Bay and is stunning. That trail will then become the Uhthoff Trail which will take you through woodlands and wetlands. Passing through the tiny town of Coldwater, and all the way to Downtown Orillia.

This is the first year Simcoe County's section of the **GREAT LAKES WATERFRONT TRAIL** is open and riding it is an accomplishment that won't be forgotten. From the farmlands and beaches to the towns and communities, this is a relatively easy ride without too many heinous climbs or challenging descents; it's the perfect trail for just about anyone.

HISTORICAL CYCLING ROUTE

Type: Paved Rail Trail Difficulty: Moderate Length: 8 km (each way) Start: Sainte-Marie among the Hurons

The Heart of Georgian Bay's Historical Cycling Route is a truly remarkable opportunity to experience the area's rich heritage and renowned landscape. Stretching 8km along the TAY SHORE TRAIL, winding through a canopy of trees and wetlands, this cycling route boasts a super enjoyable and unique way to immerse yourself in the area's historical attractions: **Wye Marsh Wildlife Centre, Martyrs' Shrine, and Sainte-Marie among the Hurons.** The Heart of Georgian Bay is proud to be the only place in Ontario to enjoy so much history in one single stretch of trail.

TINY BEACHES LOOP

Type: Road Difficulty: Moderate Length: 30 km Start: Midland Waterfront

For the true Heart of Georgian Bay ride, try the Midland to Tiny Beaches route. Riders cruise along 30km of the famous Tiny Beaches Road on a relatively flat route with only about 200 metres of climbing. Halfway through your ride, stop at Balm Beach for some relaxing waterfront time, a restaurant meal or fun at the arcade!

Note: Tiny Beaches Road can see high volume traffic on weekends in June to September.

TINY TRAIL

Type: Gravel Rail Trail Difficulty: Easy Length: 23 km (each way) Start: Parc Rotary Champlain Wendat Park

A partially paved, partially crushed gravel multiuse trail that links the North Simcoe Rail Trail to the Town of Penetanguishene's waterfront Trail. This trail meanders across Copeland Creek and the Wye River, over some of the 16 historic railway bridges. The Tiny Trail offers many points of interest along the way, including views of wildlife and a historic burial ground. Finish your ride with a well-earned meal at **Flynn's Irish Public House** in Penetanguishene.

PENETANGUISHENE LOOP

Type: Road Difficulty: Advanced Length: 50km Start: Midland Harbour

With only about 300m of climbing, this classic North Simcoe loop winds through the beautiful Awenda Provincial Park and offers several opportunities to gaze upon Georgian Bay. Stop in at the Awenda Park Store, approximately halfway through the ride, for a quick rest or swim before heading back into Midland. Note: Champlain Road can see high volume traffic on weekends in June to September

TAY SHORE TRAIL

Type: Paved Rail Trail Difficulty: Easy Length: 18km Start: Midland Waterfront

A fully paved rail trail, winding its way along the southern shore of Georgian Bay, from Midland to Waubaushene with a spur into Port McNicoll. Great vistas, and a ride through history with interpretive nature signs along route. This multi-use trail is part of the Trans Canada Trail and perfect for the whole family.

The Heart of Georgian Bay is the ideal destination for those who like cruising back roads, to take in a quiet afternoon and views of rural life. Farmers hard at work bailing hay, calves jumping with joy for life, and endless fields of vegetables planted row by row. The addition of barn quilts to the landscape provide a new approach to exploring the area by highlighting farm-based businesses and telling stories that are intrinsic to the rich fabric of Simcoe County.

Sincoe County Barn Quilts is a self-guided experience made up of over 160 barn quilts across Simcoe County, each painted with a different quilt pattern representing family traditions and local heritage. 26 of these unique art installations are located in the Heart of Georgian Bay.

But what is a barn quilt, exactly? Each quilt block is painted, not sewn, as many first think, on 8x8' aluminum panels. Using aluminum panels ensures that the quilts will last. The panels are attached to a wood frame and lag bolted to the structure to make sure they stand the test of the gustiest of Georgian Bay breezes. As for the design, each host could choose their own, under the artistic direction of local muralist, Ruth Hurdle.

For example, the quilt featured on the cover of the Simcoe County Barn Quilt map (below) is located at One Chicken Ranch in Tiny Township. Its 'double card trick' pattern was chosen by Memere Juneau, the family matriarch, as the perfect combination of her two favourite things quilting and playing cards. The quilt was painted by family and friends on location and now serves

as a bright beacon of joy after her passing. Some quilts were painted by hosts and their loved ones, or by community volunteers, and others were taken on as special projects by the residents of long term care homes.

The Cardinal (right) is one of those special projects. It made its permanent perch on a newly sided and much-loved barn located on Wood Rd. in Tay Township. It was painted by residents at Georgian Manor Long Term Care Home in Penetanguishene and is featured on a limited edition t-shirt that was created in 2021 to promote and celebrate the completion of the Simcoe County Barn Quilts project.

Along your expedition to find barn quilts in the Heart of Georgian Bay, you will find that some locations also offer the opportunity for on-farm shopping. Bring home a bottle of maple syrup from **Windlee Farm** or **William's Maple Syrup**, or pick up a beautiful bouquet of farm-grown flowers at **Georgian Roots Flower Farm**.

For those locations which do not have public storefronts, please remember to enjoy the quilts safely from the shoulder of the road.


