Train & Bus

Car, Cab, or Uber

Travel from Toronto by GO Train or Bus to Bradford, Innisfil, or Barrie. Visit gotransit. com for schedules. VIA RAIL also stops in Washago. Visit ViaRail.ca. Simcoe County LINX connects bus routes throughout the county. Visit LINX (simcoe.ca/dpt/linx) for more info. For local bus services, see municipal websites.

Drive yourself, rent a car, call a cab, or book a driver any time of the day. Some services include Uber, Lyft, Designated Driver, Keys Please, and Driverseat to name a few. Please drive sober and share the road with cyclists and pedestrians!

Did you know the county is connected by safe cycling road routes and multi-use rail trails? Check out Cycle Simcoe (cyclesimcoe.ca) for bike rentals, repair stations, routes, and more!

We don't have a ferry service, but Simcoe County has plenty of transient slips. So if you have your own boat and want to visit us, we're accessible from Georgian Bay, Lake Simcoe, and the Trent-Severn Waterway. **Airplane**

The Chute Loop

250km | One Day Highlights: Upper Big Chute Road, Georgian Bay, Coldwater, Midland, Martyrs' Shrine Named after the popular Upper Big Chute Road, this super scenic ride takes you through the northeastern portion of Simcoe County along winding roads and into old port towns including Midland and Penetanguishene. It's a historic route featuring the 101-year old Trent Severn Waterway, Martyrs' Shrine and several heritage

towns. Grab some baked goods and great coffee along the way. This day ride is perfect for those who need a little helmet time and a break from the daily


The Big Chute Loop 400km | Two Days

Highlights: Niagara Escarpment, Upper Big Chute Road, Georgian Bay

This two-day ride takes you through Simcoe County's diverse landscape, including the grand vistas from the Niagara Escarpment, the shores of Georgian Bay and Lake Simcoe, rolling farmland and the memorable Upper Big Chute Road. While this ride can technically be completed in two days, we suggest adding a day to your trip so you can take your time cruising through quaint towns, enjoying delicious food and great patios, and discovering unique historic attractions along the way.

A SAMPLE OF CYCLING ROUTES

Simcoe County Loop Trail

160 KM | OFF ROAD/RAIL TRAIL | FLAT/EASY

The Simcoe County Loop Trail is a 160-kilometre loop that travels through nine municipalities, reaches three major bodies of water, including Georgian Bay, Lake Simcoe and Lake Couchiching. And is primarily on off-road, multi-use rail trail! The route is flat, scenic and available as a multi-day tour.

Creemore Loop Trail

60 KM | ROAD | MODERATE/ADVANCED

The first portion is relatively flat and perfect for your warmup. After crossing County Road 91 you enter more challenging rolling terrain overlooking the Mad River. If you are looking for an opportunity to stop, be sure to take a break in Creemore, approximately halfway through your ride. This town, known for its beer, has some great shops too! On your way back into Collingwood, be sure your legs are ready for a short climb to a fantastic view of Georgian Bay.


FUN ON THE FARM

The Barn Quilt Trail

The Simcoe County Barn Quilt Trail is a selfguided experience and provides a new approach to exploring the area by navigating between 163 quilt locations. It highlights the county's many farmbased businesses and tell stories that are intrinsic to the rich fabric of Simcoe County. But what is a barn quilt, exactly? Each quilt block is painted, not sewn, as many first think, on 8×8' aluminum panels. Using aluminum ensures that the quilts will last. The panels are attached to a wood frame and lag bolted to the structure to make sure they stand the test of the gustiest of Georgian Bay breezes.
